HOPE FOR AGREEMENT ON ITALIAN DEBT

WASHINGTON, Nov. 7.—(U. P.)—Hope of agreeing on the terms of settlement of Italy's two billion one hundred thirty eight million dollar war debt to the United States early next week was expressed here today by a high member of the American commission.

An early agreement is quite possible, he said. The commission recessed today until Monday, presumably to allow the Italians time to communicate with their government.

HIGHER RATES ON STOCK PRESCRIBED

WASHINGTON, Nov. 7.—(U. P.)—New higher freight rates on livestock were prescribed by the Interstate Commerce Commission today for points in Oregon and Idaho to Portland, Tacoma and Seattle.

The proposed increased rates from points on the Oregon Short Line railroad in Idaho and Montana to Portland and Seattle were ordered cancelled.

Each of these plants has a warehouse and it is upon the roofs of warehouses that the guide-signs will be placed. In addition, there are many other buildings suitable to the purpose in the oil fields of the San Joaquin Valley and Southern California, at pump stations on pipe lines, and at refineries.

The roofs available for signs range from 530 square feet in small towns to several thousand square feet in the large cities.
