GOLD STRIKE IS MADE NEAR LOCATION OF SKYLINE MINE

A gold strike, with the ore obtained from the shaft panning slightly more than one dollar per pan, on an average, was reported this morning by T. M. Anderson, veteran mining man. Anderson stated that Hank Bean, foreman of the Skyline Mine operations, in the hills, a few miles southwest of Ashland, had made the strike, about 1,000 feet to the north of the old shaft. He stated that Bean had been prospecting in the neighborhood of the mine for several weeks, and that the strike made yesterday afternoon was the richest of several prospects he had located.
