HARTLEY SAYS EDUCATION MUST COME TO WASH

(Continued From Page One) jective of our interest is the common goal, a dollar's worth of education for every dollar expended." Governor Hartley said.

"In 1924 this state expended for education, exclusive of private or parochial schools the staggering total of \$23,377,560. Next year, if the maximum demands of the state's education institutions are met, this total will be swelled to \$35,555,000. More than fifty cents of every tax dollar raised in the state today is expended for education. Of the \$11,926,515, levied by the state in 1925 for 1926 expenditures, \$9,494,659, or 79.61 percent is for education, while the balance of 20.39 per cent is for all other purposes. In addition to this, the educational institutions are asking \$5,971,000 from the general fund, which if granted, will overdraw this fund in excess of one million dollars. Obviously these requests cannot be granted."

Governor Hartley recommended in detail the present fixed tax levies for the five higher learning institutions in the state be abolished, and that no general fund appropriation be made for operations, except the customary items for the State College necessary to obtain federal experimental funds. The only appropriations for new buildings which he recommended was one item for a library at the Bellingham Normal school.

He urged that some means be devised to make the Metropolitan building site endowment of the University of Washington, by bond issue or otherwise, to pay future appropriations for new buildings at the university. With the board of education should be abolished the office of state superintendent of public instruction, in the opinion of the governor. This would necessitate constitution amendment.

BLAZER ON STAND DEFENSE OF SELF

LITTLETON, Colo., Nov. 9.—(U. P.)—Dr. Harold E. Blazer took the stand in his own defense today. Blazer is on trial for killing his "human husk" daughter, 32 year old crippled imbecile.

"Hazel was born a normal child. She had spinal meningitis, and she was left a hopeless invalid," he testified. "Did it leave her any mind?" he was asked. "Not so far as I could tell," he answered. "Was she fully developed?" was a prosecution question. "Both legs and feet and her hands were like a child of 5 or 6 years old. Her body was better developed, but very much deformed by a double curvature of the spine," he answered.

Sir Eric Drummond, secretary of the League of Nations, today drew a striking parallel between the Balkan explosion of 1914 which led to the world war and the latest Balkan difficulty which was settled by the League of Nations in a few days.

Yet, he declared, in an exclusive interview with the United Press, it is not "a fair question" now to ask whether the great catastrophe of 1914 could have been averted.

"Armistice Day this year, perhaps more than ever before, brings up the question of whether the world war could have been averted," he said. "No body can answer that question, categorically if war comes, everyone
