

PARK HERE IS FIRST TO HAVE CAMP GROUND

Years Ago Camping Facilities Were Provided in Lithia Park

To Ashland goes the honor of having the first municipal auto camp in the United States. Years ago, a part of the Lithia Park was turned over to the park commissioners, to be used for the accommodation of travelers who wished to camp overnight instead of going to a hotel.

For several years, no charge was made for the use of the camp grounds. At that time, a kitchenette was provided, together with gas plates and comfort stations. In 1922, charges were first started at the camp grounds. The tourist travel since that year has seen major improvements in the accommodations at the park.

Since 1922, the park commissioners purchased the Ware-Greer property, the Stevens property, the Schomp property, and all were added to the camp ground. Shelters were already on some of the properties, and additional shelters are now being constructed. At present about six acres are contained in the camp ground.

Last year, \$10,000 was spent in improvements on the park, including the magnificent new community house. Of this amount \$3,500 was spent without the taxes of the city being increased, since the bonds voted are paid off with the proceeds of the camp grounds.

At present the park commission is made up of: Frank Jordan, president, Hal McNair, secretary, Louis Dodge, S. A. Peters Jr., and A. C. Nizinger.

1926 BUDGET ESTIMATE, JACKSON COUNTY

Pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 113, General Laws of Oregon, 1921, notice is hereby given that the County Court of Jackson County, Oregon, will meet in the Circuit Court Room of the Court House in the City of Jacksonville, Oregon, on Tuesday, the 24th day of November, 1926, at the hour of 2:00 o'clock p. m. of said day, and at the said time and place opportunity will be given for a full and complete discussion of the estimate of the amount of money proposed to be raised by taxation for the ensuing year, as published herewith, by any taxpayer subject to such tax levy when made, in favor of or against any of the proposed tax levies herein as the County Court may deem for the best interests of Jackson County.

The County Budget Committee for Jackson County, Oregon has prepared and submits the following: An estimate of the amount required for each department of County Government, County Office or County Officer, each County improvement, the maintenance of each County building, structure or institution, the salary of each County officer or employee, including those whose salaries are fixed by statute, for the improvement and maintenance of public highways, roads, bridges, the construction, operation and maintenance of each public utility and redemption of outstanding warrants; and estimate of the public receipts of the County from sources other than direct taxation upon the real and personal property in the County during the period for which such tax is to be levied and the amount of balances on hand in the funds of the County at the time the levy will be made.
