The company owns its own sawmill, located on the summit of the Siskiyous, and a body of timber sufficient to maintain the plant here for at least fifteen years, is owned close to the sawmilll. The lumber is hauled by truck to the cutup pant, or comes in by rail by way of the Ashland produced box shook other mills now running or b Siskiyou.
