## BRITAIN HELD TOGETHER BY AIRSHIP LINES

LONDON, Nov. 13—(U. P.)—Britain's hopes for linking together her far-flung posts of Empire by means of air routes, as voiced by Sir Samuel Hoare, Air Minister, are being discussed today throughout England.

"I want to see air communication between every capital in the Empire," declared the Air Minister. "I want to see the journey from Australia reduced from six weeks to two weeks, and the journey to India reduced to 100 hours."

"We have been flying only twenty-one years, and I am sure that within another twenty-one years the linking-up of the Empire will have been achieved. The longer the journey the greater the advantage of flying. As long as our main flights are between London and Paris, or London and Brussels, the full value of flying to the trade and intercourse of the country can never be realized. We must fly greater distances. The British Empire has more to gain than any other nation in the world from long distance air communication."

The first practical step in this direction which he had set himself to accomplish, said Dr. Samuel was the development of the airplane route to India.

"We have got one section of that route already working in the military all between Egypt and Bagdad. I want to see that become a regular weekly mail service between Egypt and India. Later when the two giant airships of 5,000,000 cubic feet gas capacity have been completed and are in operation, I hope to see them take over the carrying of mails and passengers directly from London to Karachi, India. Their construction is about to be started and they should be completed in two years time."

"My belief is that if these two new ships are successful, as we expect them to be, we shall in the course of time see commercial lines developed over the whole empire."

## BOYS GOUS BARRED AS TO MILITARISTIC

BUENOS AIRES, Nov. 12—(U. P.)—The Boy Scout movement has been characterized in Argentina as a harmful influence on the younger generation because of its militaristic tendencies.

This opinion was formally expressed by a special committee of the National Council of Education here when recommending that the National Association of Argentine Boy Scouts be denied the right to organize troops in the Public Schools of Buenos Aires.

"The Boy Scouts which are organized in this country present a military character which is not in accordance with the fundamental principles of our pedagogical ideals," said the committee's report.

## HARVARD HAS FALLEN FROM GRID HEIGHT

By HENRY L. FARRELL (United Press Sports Editor) NEW YORK, Nov. 13—(U. P.)—Not so many years ago, Harvard was the reigning lord of football and the ranking god of the royal Big Three. What Harvard did on the field was almost invincible and what Harvard said about football was infallible.

With a great system for developing plays and players and an endless supply of fine husky and brainy material, it must have been felt at Cambridge that the dynasty of Harvard football had a future as secure as the

royal house of England.

There were times in those regal days of the Mahans, the Hardwicks, the Brickleys, the Caseys and the Owens when a Harvard defeat would have been almost a national sensation. Perhaps in those days no Harvard man thought that a Harvard defeat would ever become such a casual event that the news of the loss would be buried in a column of type like an event of no more interest than the weather report for Syria.

Yet in just a few years Harvard football has collapsed. Percy Houghton, founder of the system that was credited with the responsibility for Harvard's success, turned to other professional fields and died later just when he was beginning to make a success of his system at Columbia.

Harvard material decreased in quality and quantity. The old grads groaned and wept and shouted for a change. "The blood of the coaches be upon their heads!" they yelled. "Our kingdom for some football players."

There must be some reason why Harvard cannot attract the boys who go from prep school to Yale and Princeton, to Dartmouth and Pennsylvania and to any number of smaller schools. The educational advantage are certainly as good at Harvard—if not better—than at any other big university and the association that can be made among the student body at Cambridge surely are as valuable as they are at Yale or Princeton.

Perhaps the tuition and the overhead at Harvard restrict the student body to boys of wealthy families and the social exactions confine the undergraduates to the off-springs of aristocracy, but there are plenty of athletes with money and family behind them at Yale and Princeton and other big universities.

There must be some reason. It is up to Harvard to find the reason, and it is beside the point to discuss any theories here because theories are not always solutions and only Harvard is in pain over the situation.

Harvard has been beaten three years in a row by Dartmouth, and according to an article in a recent issue of the Harvard Alumni Bulletin, Dartmouth will beat Harvard every time they meet in the future unless some changes are made at Harvard.

Only two avenues of escape from the Dartmouth oppression are open—either quit playing Dartmouth or get a better team than Dartmouth.

## FARMERS OF RUSSIA HAVE BOOM SEASON

MOSCOW, Nov. 13—(U. P.)—This has proved a boom year for the Russian industries and agriculture. The industries which last year turned out only about forty per cent of the pre-war output have jumped

ahead and already reached seventy per cent of pre-war production.

Even at this increased rate of production they cannot satisfy the demands of the country for goods; and it is only lack of capital to build and equip new plants which prevents the industries from attaining and even surpassing the pre-war levels of production.

The Russian harvest this year is by far the best which the country has enjoyed at any time since the Revolution. The total yield of the grain crop is estimated at 2,460,000,000 bushels, as against a yield of 1,650,000,000 bushels last year when the drought in the Lower Volga provinces and in the Ukraine constituted a serious bar to agricultural progress. In view of the anticipated harvest it seems certain that Russia will export several million tons of grain this year.

SHANGHAI, China, Nov. 13—(U. P.)—With the opening of a third track on the borders of the International Settlement, Shanghai will be able soon to

Only China-bred ponies, diminutive in size but remarkably fast and sturdy, are permitted under the rules of the clubs. The jockeys, in accordance with

British traditions, are all amateurs, but pari-mutuel machines and sweepstakes are conducted and take in huge totals.

Of the two clubs now in existence, one is purely foreign and the other foreign and Chinese in membership. The new club is being organized by Chinese.
