ROYAL STOCK SHOW OPENS GATES TODAY

KANSAS CITY, Mo., Nov. 13 (U. P.)—The best blooded live stock of the country will be placed on display here tomorrow with the opening of the 27th annual American Royal Livestock Show, which will continue for the next week.

The American Royal this year is the biggest and most varied in its history. Fancy breeders of twenty odd states, from coast to coast and from Canada to the Gulf, have entered their best for the \$75,000 in premiums offered. For the first time in the history of the American Royal the dairy cattle class is added as a new feature, due to the demands of the dairy breeders of the Mid-West. Last year 145,000 visitors were accommodated but the directors of the organization are able this year to take care of more exhibits and larger attendance as the structure has been rebuilt on a larger scale since it burned last winter. Twenty-seven years ago, instituted by the Holstein breeders the first American Royal was

MAN IS WOUNDED BY UNKNOWN ATTACKER

PORTLAND, Nov. 13—(U. P.)—Authorities are baffled by the mysterious shooting affair today when a farm hand, Sherman Edgington, 30, was shot by an unidentified assailant in a field near Linnton.

Edgington suffered a flesh wound in the abdomen, but it is not serious. About two weeks ago, two men beat him into unconsciousness. He did not know them. On Armistice Day he received a note saying, "We'll do a better job next time. Better get out of the country."

Edgington said his attacker today waited for him across a field, and then shot him with a revolver. The man turned and fled when Edgington dropped to the ground.

Bert Kerns, guard, and Beryl Hodgen, half-back, were injured in the games against the California teams. Hodgen has a sprained ankle and will be out for the season. Two of Kerns ribs caved in, but he will take his place at guard heavily bandaged.

COUNTY GETS \$202,000 FROM SCHOOL FUND

Union County is Heaviest Borrower, Report of Clerk Indicates

SALEM, Ore., Nov. 13—With loans from the common school fund of the state aggregating \$596,754, Union county is the heaviest borrower among all the

counties of the state from that fund, says a statement prepared by G. G. Brown, clerk of the state land board.

At the close of business October 30 the total loans from the school fund were \$6,821,612.35, while rural credit loans aggregated \$421,324.51. In loans from the school fund Wheeler county is second with \$424,045.

Marion county's loans from the school fund are \$278,993.18 and from the rural credits fund \$29,305.90. Lane county has loans aggregating \$113,366 from the school fund and \$4,791.81 from the rural credits fund. Jackson county has borrowed \$202,229 from the school fund and \$31,404.51 from the rural credits fund. Deschutes county's loans from the two funds are \$95,270 and \$4,831.60, respectively, and Umatilla county's loans from the two funds are

\$217,495 and \$4,536.58, respectively. Douglas county has borrowed \$66,054 from the school fund and \$19,312.95 from the two funds. Multnomah county has borrowed \$119,794 and \$4,795.81 from the school fund and \$19,312.95 from the two funds.
