## RED GRANGE SHOWED UP AN EASTERN TEAM

NEW YORK, Nov. 14.—(UP)—When Sam Hildreth, trained of the rich Rapocosa Stable, was saddling the great Zev for his memorable race against Papyrus, winner of the English Derby, Jack McAuliffe, the veteran retired lightweight champion, said to him:  
"It's too bad the going is so bad out there. It won't be a race."  
Hildreth took a look at the course, flocked deep in mud and replied:  
"Bosh, Jack! You know better than that. A real thoroughbred can run in anything. Watch my fellow go."  
If Hildreth's philosophy of the track can be applied to the football field—Red Grange is a real thoroughbred.  
Football has no form sheets like race addicts have to assist them in picking the right horse, but weaknesses of players can be recorded by observation.  
For three years the middle west perhaps the warmest hotbed of football in the country, knew that Red Grange (it is not necessary further to identify him) was one of the greatest of all football players.  
But, the Western Conference rivals of Illinois would say—"He can't go in mud. He has to have a dry track."

Grange came east a week before last to play Pennsylvania. He brought ten other football players with him but they were lost in the glare of publicity that attended the first appearance of a player whose middle western feats had likened him to a story-book hero.  
The day before the game the Illinois squad arrived in Philadelphia to find the historic city under a blanket of snow. It was a wet pre-season snow and the playing field at Franklin Field was being turned into a mud puddle.  
"It's too bad," Bob Zuppke, the genial Illinois coach said. "This was the game that I have been living for. I wanted a dry field to show the east that our Red is not a false alarm. That boy has been living and working a year for this one game. This mud is an awful blow."  
Zuppke's mournful words and the gloom of the entire Illinois squad did not cause a change in the market, however. Penn state alumni had heard that Grange couldn't go in the mud and they dumped piles of money into a pool and placed in that Penn would win. This was tantamount to a bet that Red Grange would be stopped.
