French Delegates "Talked too Much" Paris Now Feels

PARIS, Nov. 20—(U. P.)—Sympathetic American women residing in France misled the members of the French deputation commission before they went to Washington, according to Stephanie Lausanne, prominent journalist of the Matin and friend of M. Caillaux.

He told members of the American Women's Club upon his return that they could have rendered the delegates greater service if they had told the truth about America.

Lausanne frankly admitted that the French delegates had been too confident and that they had talked too much. But to show both sides of the question he added: "You ladies committed as bad a blunder here in Paris as we did in talking too much in Washington. In your sympathies you had always given us a false idea of this matter. You gave us the impression that the debt would be wiped out. Perhaps your wishes are the wishes of New York, but you had forgotten to remind us that New York is only a small part of America."

ANNULMENT CASE AGAIN POSTPONED
WHITE PLAINS, N. Y., Nov. 20—(U. P.)—The marriage annulment case of Leonard Kip Rhineland against his colored wife, Alice, was abruptly adjourned until Monday, today by Supreme Court Justice Morschauer. The court's action followed a conference between Morschauer and attorneys for both sides. What went on behind the closed doors was unrevealed.

PLYMOUTH, England, Nov. 20—(U. P.)—"In the matter of dressing men are fools compared with women."

Hastings expects the support of delegations from Tacoma and Spokane. Altogether 20 bills were introduced in the Senate this morning.

The increase in high school students was explained by Mrs. Carter by the fact that more students are finishing grade school than in 1920, so that more enter high school. This, it is thought, accounts largely for the fact that high school attendance showed an increase of 10 per cent more than the grade schools.

The figures were compiled to show that increases were needed in school appropriations next year.

For two years, said Mrs. Carter, no land in the county has been untaxed for school purposes. All lapsed districts have been joined with others, to keep the tax burden evenly distributed.
