

# OREGON 11 IS PREPARING FOR HUSKIE CLASH

UNIVERSITY OF OREGON, Eugene, Nov. 25—(Special)—Faced with the problem of rebuilding his Oregon team for the final game of the season against the University of Washington in Seattle, November 26, Coach Dick Smith has his team working in earnest this week.

With all injured men on deck, the players are being shifted back and forth between the first and second teams, giving each man a chance to prove himself.

Beryl Hodgen, who was injured in the California game, is back in the lineup trying to recover his place at half, now held by Otto Vitus. Ick Reynolds, end aspirant, has been shifted to fullback as an understudy for Jones.

Oregon's weakness in punting, as shown in the past few games, has the coaches worried so in a last minute effort they are trying Harrison. Harrison is booting long spirals in practice and looks to be the best bet. However, he is a quarterback and with him in, Anderson may not play.

Drill on defensive formation, in which the backfield men back up the line in close formation, is being held. This is due to the strength of the Washington line-plunging attack which Oregon will run against Thanksgiving day.

Coach Smith is working for defensive perfection in an endeavor to hold the strong Husky to as small a score as possible, he says. The offense of the team will be virtually the same as that used in former games.

Kiminki and Minnaugh also are being worked out in backfield positions in practice this week. There is small possibility of their playing in the game but they will be prepared in an emergency.

# COLLEGE GIRL IDEAL IS AN IMPOSSIBILITY

UNIVERSITY OF OREGON, Eugene, Nov. 25—(Special)—"I could not formulate an ideal college girl," said Virginia Judy Esterly, dean of women at the University of Oregon, when asked to do so. "There are so many types that all are a distinct benefit to their college. I should say that the only essential qualities in a college woman are a respectful attitude toward the dignity and culture of scholarship and a desire to advance the welfare of her college."

Family background or early training make no difference, according to Dean Esterly, if these two essentials are present. Mrs. Esterly believes that girls can be classified into three main groups—those interested in scholarship, those socially inclined, and those with athletic ability. All of these types are ideal in her opinion if they develop according to their own natures.

An extreme of age is a disadvantage in making the college girl. Those entering too young or too old meet with difficulties. The dean of women declared that are not experienced by the average college girl. She said, however, that no one ideal age could be determined.

"I think that the clothes of the modern college girl are delightful," Dean Esterly smiled. "I love the bright-colored slick-

ers with figures pointed on them, and the straight sensible dresses that are now in vogue. I like the girls to dress in accordance with the times, and I am thankful that the present styles are so sensible and appropriate."

# Parent - Teacher Notes

Our object is to: first, promote child welfare in the home, school, and community, to raise the standards of home life, to secure more adequate laws for the protection of women and children. tion the program was built around the theme, "Home and School in Education." These were parents on the program and there were teachers on the program. The fact is not without significance as a guarantee that the time has come when teacher and parent have joined hands in the education of the child. They stand shoulder to shoulder with faith in each other ready to meet the responsibility together.

The problem of the young has never been quite solved. Often the best their elders do is to express horror and wonder at what the world is coming to, but lamentations cure no ailments they only aggravate them. Youths of today have had facilities of speed thrust upon them and it is most natural they should "step on the gas."

Let us bear in mind that juvenile protection is trying to aid parents and teachers to instill into the mind of children a conscious desire to do right until the right way of thinking becomes a habit.

"You can't expect the police department to raise your children." When we remember that most of our criminals are under twenty years of age and nearly all who are arrested have no definite work but are loafers—we realize the great need of an awakened parenthood.
