In the history of Southern Oregon, and pre-game forecasts indicates a crowd of 5,000. Medford played to 3,000 people on Armistice day, and 2500 in the Marshfield game earlier in the season. Both teams are evenly matched, as to experience, Salem having the advantage in weight and Medford in speed. The dope on the respective ability of the two teams from this season's games is as follows: Albany beat North Bend, 28 to 0; Salem beat Albany, 3 to 0; North Bend played Marshfield to a nothing to nothing tie, and Medford defeated Marshfield, 41 to 7. The way the dopsters figure, these scores make the teams about evenly matched.
