Last night through arrangements of Rev. V. K. Allison with High School authorities the Evangelistic services at the Church of Christ started at 7 p. m., and the High School Play started at 8:15. To the satisfaction of the church and to the surprise of the Evangelist 7:00 p. m., found the largest crowd yet this week to greet him. Twenty people were there from Medford to swell the crowd. Mr. Allison sang a solo entitled: "In the Garden." Mr. Myers delivered a sermon of the Deity of Jesus.
