MORE VETS IN HOSPITAL THAN EVER BEFORE

The terrible aftermath of the war was shown by General Hipse's statement that 211,644 veterans are disabled from wounds or diseases contracted while in the service and that 27,325 veterans have died since the Bureau was established. Neuropsychiatric diseases were the major cause of disability, Hipse said. There were 44,844 neuropsychiatric cases under care of the Veterans Bureau on June 30. To the soldiers who suffered mental disorders from the war the government is paying \$2,017,705 monthly. Tuberculosis was the disabling cause in 45,839 cases and the monthly payment on these cases was \$2,875,565. Fifty two per cent of the tuberculosis cases were rated as totally disabled. General medical and surgical conditions were the cause of disability in 129,960 cases of 57-2 per cent of the entire number of cases on which disability compensation was being paid by the government. The monthly value of payments for the general cases was \$3,094,000. Vocational training work of the Veterans Bureau has practically been completed, Hipse reported.

WHOLE NATION IS OPTIMISTIC SAYS MELLON

Following the funding agreements now completed for an aggregate of \$7,389,941,000 of foreign debts due this government, Mellon said most of the remaining debts of \$4,745,955,617 would probably be settled within a year. He justified the lenient funding terms granted, saying: "While the integrity of international obligations must be maintained it is axiomatic that no nation can be required to pay to another government sums in excess of its capacity to pay. . . . No settlement which is oppressive and retards the recovery and development of the foreign debtor is to the best interests of the United States or of Europe." But the secretary sees in the Locarno security pact, and other recent European events, justification for an optimistic view regarding economic rehabilitation over there. "With the working out of the Dawes plan, the settlement of inter-allied debts, the reorganization of currency systems, and the stabilization of exchanges however, many uncertainties have been removed and the way is clear for more complete world recovery," he said. "While this country has every desire to see its surplus resources at work in the economic reconstruction and development of countries abroad, national interest demands that our resources be not permitted to flow into countries which do not honor their obligations," was Mellon's explanation to the Administration's ban on private credits to countries failing to fund war debts to the United States. The Secretary's summary of domestic prosperity follows: "Corporate profits are running higher than for any previous year since 1919. Employment has been good, prices comparatively stable, and trade on a high level as re-
