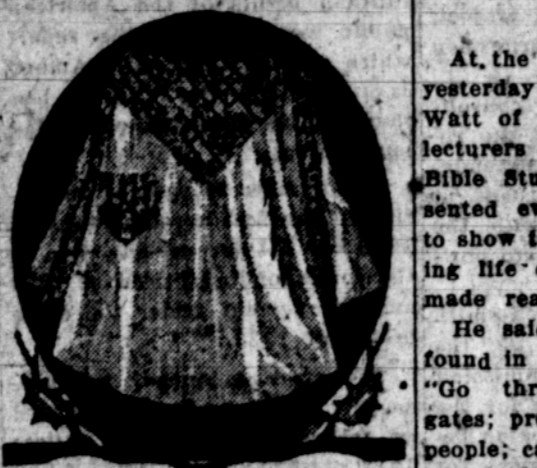

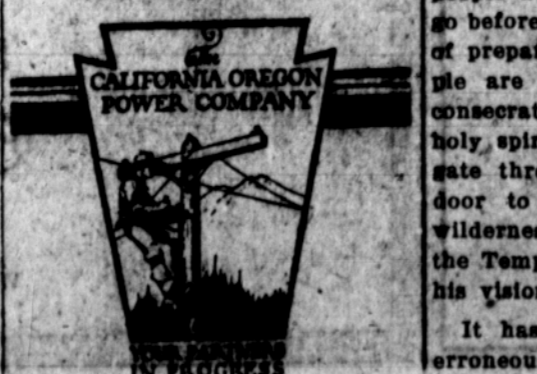

**THE HIGHWAY TO LIFE**

Millions Now Living Will Never Die

At the Moose Hall Auditorium yesterday at 8 p. m., Mr. J. C. Watt of New York, one of the lecturers of the International Bible Students Association, presented evidence from the Bible to show that the way to everlasting life on earth is now being made ready.

He said in part: Our text is found in Isaiah 42:10. It reads: "Go through, ye through the gates; prepare ye the way of the people; cast up, cast up the highway; gather out the stones; lift up a standard for the people."

The advent of the automobile brought with it the superb concrete surfaced boulevards which now traverse the country from end to end. The states vie with one another to see which shall have the best highways and thus attract the most tourists. Hence we live in a day when the construction of superior highways is a very familiar sight.

The highways which men are constructing for purposes of automobile traffic are important. They make possible the full development of millions of acres of food-producing lands which are now partly or wholly idle. They are part and parcel of God's arrangements for distributing food to the billions of humanity who will shortly come forth from their graves in obedience to the Saviour's promise, in St. John's gospel, the fifth chapter, the 28th and 29th verses: "For the hour is coming, in which all that are in their graves shall hear his voice, and shall come forth."

But important as are these national roadways which are being designed by our highway engineers and built with consummate skill, the highway mentioned in our text is of still greater importance. It is the highway of life, the way over which myriads of the human family, after being awakened from the sleep of death may come back into full harmony with God, and obtain the reward of that harmony in the blessing of everlasting life here on earth. Notice the way the same prophet put this matter in the same chapter in which he tells us that "the wilderness, and the solitary place, shall be glad for them; and the desert shall rejoice, and blossom as a rose," and "in the wilderness shall waters break out, and streams in the desert and the parched ground shall become a pool, and the thirsty land springs of water."—Isaiah 35:1-7.

After setting forth these conditions which will prevail in the Millennium, and which will be world-wide, the prophet continues, "And an highway shall be there, and a way, and it shall be called, The way of holiness; the unclean shall not pass over it: but it shall be for those: the wayfaring men, though fools, shall not err therein."

It is this highway of life, thus described in the 25th chapter of Isaiah's prophecy which is referred to in the words of our text, and which God instructs his own people of the Gospel Age to prepare so that the world of mankind, living and dead, may walk thereupon in the Millennial Age, now opening before us.

The gates through which God's people at the present time must go before they can begin the work of preparing the way of the people are primarily, the gates of consecration and anointing of the holy spirit represented by the gate through the court and the door to the Tabernacle in the wilderness, and by the gates of the Temple which Ezekiel saw in his vision.

It has been the popular, but erroneous thought, that the way

of the people was prepared long ago. But a little reflection will show that until the present time there has been no way by which the human family could come back to holiness and everlasting life on earth, nor any way at all which has been so plain that "the wayfaring men, though fools, shall not err therein."

Any careful student of the Scriptures can see for himself that the people are promised safety (Ezekiel 28:26; Isaiah 32:17,18); they are promised freedom from care (Micah 4:4); they are promised justice (Psalm 72:3,4); truth (Zephaniah 3:8,9; Psalm 96:10-13; Revelation 20:1-3); comfort (Isaiah 49:13; Revelation 21:4); joy (Isaiah 35:10; Psalm 30:5); love (Zechariah 3:10); guidance (Isaiah 11:10); protection (Ezekiel 37:23,24); a feast of fat things (Isaiah 25:6); a vision of the glory of the Lord (Isaiah 40:4,5); health and forgiveness (Isaiah 33:24); life and salvation (Deuteronomy 10:15; Isaiah 25:7, 8; 52:10); righteousness (Isaiah 60:21); knowledge of God (Jeremiah 31:34); adoration of God (Malachi 1:11); heart union with God (Jeremiah 34:7; Psalm 86: 9; Jeremiah 23:8, 9); heart union with Christ (Philippians 2:10, 11; Haggai 2:7).

No way by which the people could come to these blessings has been opened hitherto, but it is opening now. One after another the great granite blocks of truth are being lifted from the places where they have lain neglected for centuries. One by one these imperishable and unchangeable gifts from God to man are finding their proper place, and thus slowly the roadway over which humanity may march back into harmony with God is being prepared. This roadway is to endure throughout eternity. Appropriately, it is called the way of holiness.

The wise man designates this highway somewhat similarly when he calls it "the highway of the upright" (Proverbs 16:17), and indicates that it is to be used "to depart from evil." This highway, the preceding verse suggests is not a literal highway but it is the path of wisdom and understanding rather to be chosen than either gold or silver. Quite likely the same high way is indicated in the prophecy, "Set thee up waymarks, make thee high heaps; set thine heart toward the highway."—Jeremiah 31:21.

Before a modern concrete highway can be used, every stone or other obstruction that could interfere with traffic is first removed. The expression in our text "gather out the stones" takes advantage of this familiar figure to call attention to a great fact; namely, that before the world of mankind can come back into harmony with God the stumbling stones of unconditional immorality, purgatory, eternal torture, and the trinity with all their related errors of apostolic succession, and the recognition of the integral parts of Satan's empire as part of Christ's kingdom, must all be removed.

Nothing could be plainer than that the use of this highway is in the future. Some have thought that it is in the present, because of the statement that "the redeemed shall walk there"; but these should have noticed that the promised way is to be so plain that a fool could not fall to stay on it. But we now have upwards of 160 sects traveling 160 different ways and certainly 160 of them are wrong.

Moreover, the prophet points out that on this way which is to be opened up shortly, "the ransomed of the Lord shall return." We have seen that all that are in their graves are to return. We have only to couple with this the statement, "He gave himself a ransom for all" (1 Timothy 2:6), to realize that this means that all mankind will return from their graves "and come to Zion (come back into harmony with God's arrangement) with songs and everlasting joy upon their heads: they shall obtain joy and gladness, and sorrow and sighing shall see away."

**Griddle Cakes - Fruit Fritters - Popovers - and eight more! from ONE Master Recipe**

Griddle Cakes for breakfast. And from left-over batter, Pineapple Fritters for lunch! That's one reason you'll enjoy using this Master Recipe. But it's only one of eleven reasons—every one delicious!

Popovers are another. You didn't dream that these hollow, muffin-shaped cakes were related to Griddle Cakes; yet a slight change in that Master Recipe—and there they are! Here's how you do it!

**The Sperry Master Recipe for Griddle Cakes**

- 2 cups Sperry Drifted Snow Flour
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1 egg
- 1/2 cup milk
- 1 tablespoon sugar
- 1 tablespoon melted shortening
- 1/2 cup milk

Measure and sift dry ingredients; beat egg until very light, then add milk and combine mixture, beating with rotary egg beater until free from lumps. Add melted shortening and bake at once. If batter is not baked soon after mixing, beat well again before using. If only one-half recipe is needed, still use the whole egg.

Except that baking powder is omitted, the Popover recipe is almost identical to the Griddle Cake recipe. Use only 1 cup of flour, 1 cup of milk, 2 eggs, 1/2 teaspoon salt and 1 teaspoon of melted butter. Beat flour and milk until smooth; add 1 egg unbeaten and beat mixture one minute; add other egg and beat again; then add melted butter. Measure with a cup; use hard cups or iron muffin pans heating. They should be hot. Grease well just before adding batter, 2/3 full. Bake in hot oven (400° F.) 15 minutes; then reduce heat and bake 30 minutes longer. Bake thoroughly, or Popovers may fall.

**Pineapple Fritters**  
Use left-over Griddle Cake batter, or prepare 1/2 Master Recipe. Drain slices of pineapple; dip into batter, then drop into hot deep fat and fry until a golden brown on each side. (A small cube of dry bread dropped into fat should turn golden brown while you count forty.) If you substitute other fruits, such as apples or bananas, fry longer, testing bread by counting to ninety.
