into a first class mountain road. A road from Fish Lake ending in the vicinity of Four Bit creek was also completed.

A trail, seven miles long, from Lamb's mine to McDonald Gap, around the south end of Ashland mountain, was made and 26 miles on the tributaries of the North Fork of Rogue river were completed. Eight and one-fourth miles of new trail on the south and middle forks of the same river furnishes a much needed patrol route to a hitherto inaccessible region. Ten miles were built near the Lake of the Woods into a country of many scenic attractions as well as timber resources. Thirteen miles were completed on the Klamath side of the Cascade divide near the Crater Lake National park. This trail, when completed, is to join the middle fork of the Rogue trail.

A standard lookout house, two stories and glass enclosed, was erected on Hershberger mountain and is expected to be of great value in fire detection in the Upper Rogue River district. The material was packed by mules over a trail for a distance of approximately 10 miles.

A log cabin for the use of the fire guard at Union creek was also completed. The cabin was erected by the guard and the logs were cut in the vicinity.

During the spring and fall, two crews of laborers were engaged in maintaining several hundred miles of road while two additional crews worked on trail maintenance. Maintenance work, it is understood, was unusually heavy this year because of the windfalls from heavy wind storms of last winter.

**ALL IS WELL WITH NAVY, SAYS WILBUR**

Higher food prices and depleted war stocks of clothing will increase expenditures next year, according to the report, although the ration cost for this year increased only four percent compared with the nation-wide increase food prices of 15 percent.

Reporting on new construction, Wilbur said the aircraft carriers Saratoga and Lexington would be completed by the end of 1926, and the submarine tender Holland by next spring. Besides other auxiliary craft under con-

struction, work will be started during the current fiscal year on two fleet submarines, two light cruisers, and six river gunboats for duty in China.

The battleships Texas and Arkansas and Florida are being modernized, and three others will be added.

"On account of the expense involved," the report stated, "the material work on the vessels of the fleet has been confined chiefly to repairs, and it has been necessary to limit the authorized alterations and improvements to those for which special allotments of funds were made. As a general result the material condition of the ships in and out of commission as a whole, has been somewhat improved, but many alterations of military value are held in Wilbur's summary of naval aircraft plans follows:
