RUSH OF BILLS SENT INTO WASH. BODIES

OLYMPIA, Dec. 15. — (LP) — A rush of last minute bills were introduced today, the final day for introduction of measures as set by a joint agreement of the two legislative houses. Several of the bills had to do with financial matters.

Senator Long of Franklin county introduced a bill providing for the creation of a depositors' guaranty commission, composed of the governor, the supervisor of banking, and three members, to be appointed by the governor.

The commission would pass upon the qualifications of each bank which applies for admission under the depositors' guaranty fund.

The Douglas King bill introduced today, provided that each city shall create a fund to guarantee local improvement district bonds, but making it optional whether the bonds now delinquent are paid.

COMMISSION GETS BRIEFS IN RAIL WAR

line, but over a route that is substantially contiguous to the existing Sishorn line and its prior proposed Williamson river extension. We submit that the law under which the application is made was intended to prevent carriers from attempting to satisfy any feeling of disappointment in the manner here proposed.

Then the public service commission adds its voice to the final argument as follows:

"We believe the power privileges and the monopolistic control now sought and asked by the Southern Pacific is beyond the authority of the transportation act, quite contrary to its spirit and offensive to the sections and opinions of the Supreme court, as well as offensive to the judgment and experience of this commission.

"The Southern Pacific and Union Pacific seek to further extend monopolistic control by refraining from competing for Oregon traffic. Not only does the Southern Pacific seek to acquire other competing lines but it asks this commission to deny the northern lines access into the Klamath Basin. Manifestly the ambitious program outlined by the Southern Pacific, and to some extent at least, aided by the Union Pacific, presages a combination in restraint of trade as effective and dangerous as any proclaimed against by the United States supreme court."

Since timber traffic is the prime goal of the competing railroad systems considerable attention is given this subject. The northern lines say that "the time has come when the timber resources of these regions are in demand," and that "these timber resources are amply sufficient to support the railroads proposed, so that as the timber is depleted, the agricul-

tural lands may be developed and made productive."

To this the Southern Pacific hands a solar plexus blow by claiming that the northern lines are only interested in denuding the country of its forest wealth as quickly as possible without consideration of reforestation concluding with the statement that "the coming of the Oregon Trunk will plant no new trees nor make existing trees grow faster."

Considerable attention also is given to use of the Portland gateway with the Southern Pacific, pleading the right to be permitted to show results of Portland gateway use after completion of the Natron cutoff line; while the Northern lines contend that there is no reason to anticipate greater use of the gateway in the future when the Southern Pacific has failed to use it under equally favorable rate structures in the past.

The public service commission raises its voice to declare that use of the Portland gateway by the Southern Pacific is impossible under the Ogden gateway agreement between the Union Pacific and the Southern Pacific and insists that only a cross-state line will fill the needs of the state.

The Southern Pacific maintains its opposition to entrance of the northern lines into the Klamath basin while the northern lines continue to offer support of any joint construction program. The public service commission supports the northern lines in this respect.

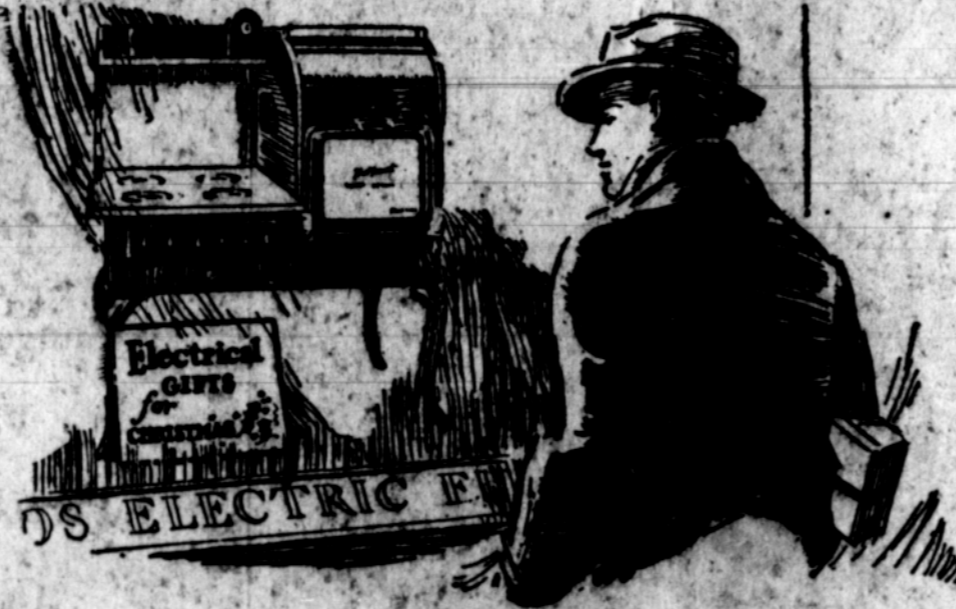
