during the time she has been negotiating for the hospital lease, and as far as she knew, was still her attorney.

All those who received wires from Winburn declared they could not understand his reference to the position taken by the Tidings concerning the matter. Absolutely no stand has been taken, the management of the Tidings remaining neutral concerning the deal. Those who read Mr. Winburn's many wires declare he must be gifted with a second sight to be able to read between the lines so well.

Mayor Johnson, when interviewed in regard to the above telegram stated that he had made no promises to Mr. Winburn as to who should have the hospital lease; that all of the bids for the leasing of the hospital were rejected at the meeting held on the fifteenth of December, 1925; that the Mayor and Council subsequently entered into a lease with Miss Jean Alchison for the hospital; that the Mayor and Council have only tried to exercise their best judgment in the matter, and they felt that it would be better to have a graduate nurse

in charge of the operation of the hospital; that the city is deeply grateful to Mr. Winburn for the gift of the hospital, but that since the city accepted the gift, and its care, it is essential that the administration freely use their best discretion in leasing and improving the same.
