STATE SCHOOL HEAD CANDIDATE IS HERE

Charles A. Howard, superintendent of schools of Marshfield and a candidate for the Republican nomination for state superintendent of schools, was a visitor in Ashland this morning, renewing old acquaintances. Howard has been identified with educational work in Southern Oregon for eighteen years, teaching in the Klamath county school, then acting in the capacity of superintendent of schools at Coquille. From Coquille he advanced to the principalship of the Eugene high school, and in 1920 went to Marshfield as superintendent of schools.

TWO HELD FOR THEFT SAID BANK BANDITS

PORTLAND, Jan. 8. — (AP) — Two of the three young men held by the federal authorities at Redding, California for alleged auto theft were identified today by photographs as participants in two bank robberies near here. The youths in custody are John Moore, Norman Moore and Joe Billings of Oregon City. John Moore and Billings are identified by the cashier as participants in the Troutdale, Oregon bank robbery on December 10. They were also identified by the cashier of the Scotts Mills Bank, which was robbed on December 24.

HAIR AIDS POOR
LOS ANGELES.— The Goodwill Industries are collecting hair which they turn into profit for charitable purposes. In one week this organization received more than 50 pounds of hair from young women who had shorn their locks. This hair was made into wigs and switches. The proceeds were devoted to work among the poor.

SACRAMENTO, JAN. 8. — It is all very well to snicker at the goat as a muncher of tin cans. Compared with other domestic animals he has an iron constitution. Of the 445 animals condemned by state meat inspectors last month as diseased and therefore unfit for human consumption, 293 were cattle, 73 hogs, 15 sheep, 64 calves, 10 goats was condemned.

"The goat is practically immune from tuberculosis," explained Dr. Geo. Jordan of the department of agriculture meat inspecting bureau, in giving out the figures today, and tuberculosis was the ground for 315 of the 445 condemnations.

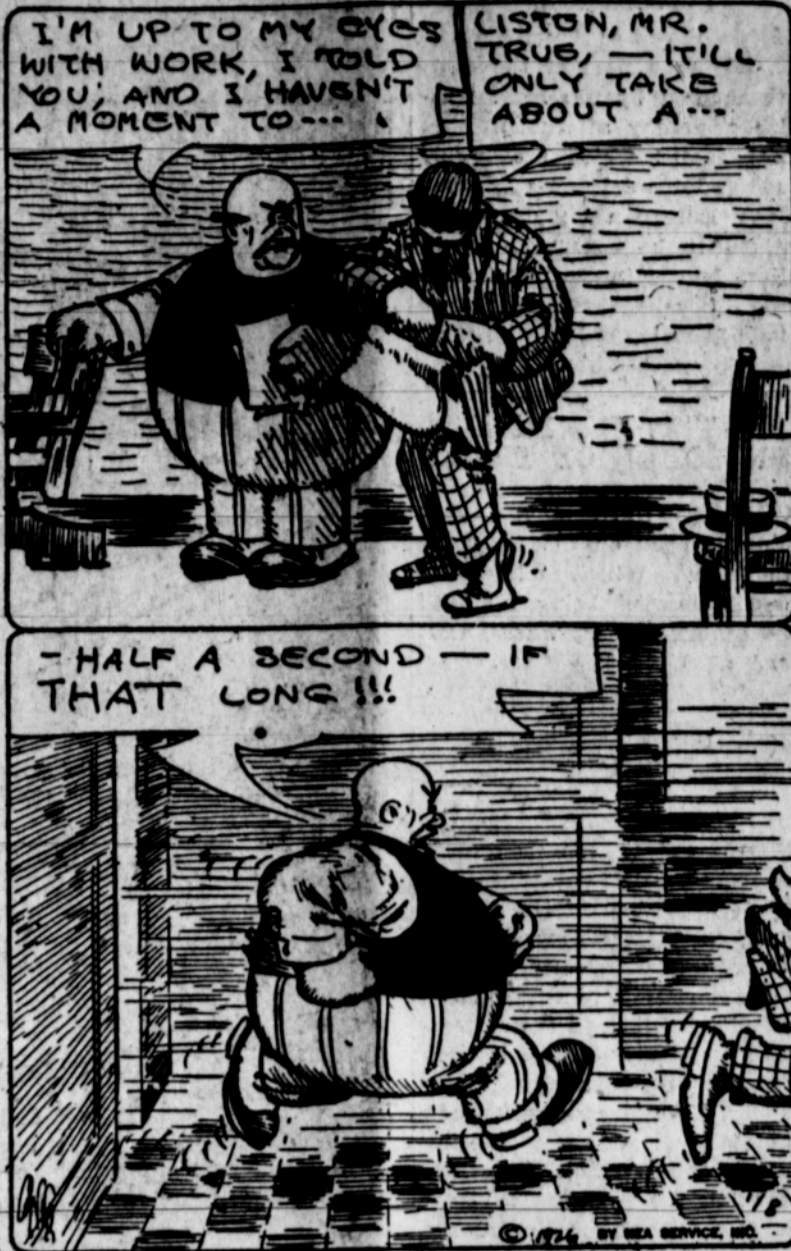
PAT GRACE GETS STIFF SENTENCE
