treaty launched on the subject. To date the league has launched nearly a score of such treaties covering white slave traffic. opium traffic, obsene literature, customs formalities, internationetc., while the International Labor Bureau has prepared regulating labor conditions.

All of these, subject to the inerpretation and enforcement by the League's Permanent Court of International Justice at the Hague constitute the foundation of the new code on international built up by the League.
