### STEWART'S WASHINGTON LETTER

WASHINGTON—Most towns have two "sides," a side where all the tony people hang out and a side where nobody can live and amount to much socially.

Washington is emphatically this way.

Your address must read "Washington Northwest" or you don't "belong." A trip to Washington Northwest of Soonsville is like journeying to an entirely different city.

Why Washington Southwest doesn't class with the northwest district is easy to understand. It's the industrial section so far as the capital has one and naturally isn't so pleasant to live in.

But accounting for the eastern half of town's social dispute, except for a little stretch along the railroad yards, isn't so easy.

It's true that the houses there obviously and practically without exception are those of people in very modest circumstances, but why Washington's crowded for room. Why hasn't the classy part of it spread over into this perfectly available area?

Another thing, the capitol building marks the boundary line between the two "sides."

It would seem as if well people would be attracted to put up fine homes in the vicinity of the historic edifice, with its fine grounds and pleasant outlook.

On the contrary, however, nobly Washington only goes as far east as the group of buildings including the capitol, the senate and house office buildings and the congressional library and stops there. It's as if the capitol stopped it.

### PROTESTS STOP PASSAGE OF MARRIAGE CODE

RIGA, Jan. 15 (AP)—The expected passage of the revised code of Soviet marriage laws which was to place all forms of cohabitation on an equal basis whether registered or unregistered has received a setback at the hands of Russian women.

The law had already passed the Central Committee of the Soviet Party, and several other government departments and when introduced before the Central Executive Committee or "Red Parliament" as it is sometimes called, it was presupposed that its passage would be but a matter of ordinary routine.

But the reading of the revised code was greeted with cries of protest on the part of many women present. They pointed out that the revised code permitted even looser relations than now existed in the family ties and that present conditions were bad enough.

Loose marriage regulations together with the facilities and inducements for divorce, they argued, had filled the country with vagrant, outcast children and produced a multitude of deserted and divorced wives. Although under the present code some men had married and divorced as many as ten women in one year, all legally, they felt, they said, that the present law afforded the women more protection than that provided under the new law.

In the face of this unexpected storm of protest the Executive Committee found itself unable to muster enough votes to pass the revised code. President Kalinin then announced that the measure would for the time being be withdrawn and not reintroduced until it has been thoroughly discussed in the lower village Soviets, district Soviets, Women's departments and in the Press.
