GAS TAX IS CLAIMED AS CONSTITUTIONAL

PORTLAND, Jan. 18—(U. P.)—Oregon's gasoline tax is constitutional.

United States Judge Wobverton today threw out of court the suit filed by a long list of truck operators, who sought to establish that the tax is in fact a toll, charged against autoists using rural post roads, and that consequently it was a violation of the federal post roads act. At the same time the court denied the plea for the return of \$6,000,000 which the truck drivers declared was collected illegally under the gas tax.

The decision will bear on similar gasoline tax laws in other states, which receive government funds for highway construction.
