GEAR'S GEMS STORED IN PLAIN BASEMENT

MOSCOW, Jan. 20 - (U. P.) - Nowhere in the world, perhaps, can one find such a spectacle of mingled wealth and brilliance as is offered by the Russian Imperial Crown Jewels, now the most carefully guarded state treasure of the Soviets.

The value of the jewels may be gauged from the fact that seven pieces which make up the imperial regalia are valued at \$175,000,000. And the Tsarist hoard includes numerous smaller stones and ornaments, flashing with all the varied colors of the rainbow.

All these treasures are stored away in fireproof trunks in the stone cellars of a Moscow money-smelting establishment. No one wears them any longer and they are exhibited in a plain bare room, without any atmosphere of imperial splendor. But their extraordinary lustre is still undimmed.

FRANCE, EDGES FAILURE BUT STILL FIGHTS

 PARIS, Jan. 20 - (U. P.) - France, victorious in the World War, is in the throes of another great battle, the battle of falling money and rising prices, the struggle to save the country from financial disaster.

There are no scenes such as in the inflation days at Berlin, Moscow, Vienna and Budapest, where the most insignificant articles of every-day life cost millions and where a convulsion of the money market meant to the natives a change from living to starving.

But though France so far has been spared this worst of modern post-war tragedies, there are signs, and these signs have been growing during the most recent political upheavals that a stronger
