F. D. Browne, Veteran Engineer, Was Member of Union

Funeral services for Frederick D. Browne, veteran locomotive engineer of the Southern Pacific, will be held Saturday morning from the San Rafael Presbyterian church.

Browne entered Southern Pacific service as a fireman in 1873 and three years later was appointed assistant engineer. He worked on the location and construction of Southern Pacific's line through the Siskiyou mountains, the line from San Pedro to Point Pirrama and White Springs to Arizona.
