In front of the stairs will spread a plaza, and at each end will be a lagoon, 350 ft. long and 150 feet wide, surrounded by a wide esplanade on four sides. At the head of the lagoon will be erected a granite sarcophagus in which will be deposited the dust of an unknown Confederate soldier. On top of the tomb will rest the recumbent figure of a confederate soldier wrapped in a confederate flag.

At the foot of the lagoon will be an imposing entrance, consisting of twin columns and at each outside corner will be a granite building, one for the Custodian and the other for the office of the Stone Mountain Memorial Association. Running across the entrance will be a wide boulevard.
The steps and terraces surrounding the lagoon and the benches between the formal rows of trees will have a seating capacity of 15,000 persons.
