HOOD RIVER, Ore., Feb. 8.—A. D. Moe, a publisher here, who left last week for California to spend the remainder of the winter, has written back that the Pacific highway over the Siakiyous was in good condition. Mr. and Mrs. Moe annually motor to California for the winter months. This year they were accompanied by E. O. Blanchard, banker, and Mrs. Blanchard.

"We made an early start from Grants Pass to get over the mountains. The pavement was frosty, but no ice, and it was not dangerous. We spent a little time in Medford, then started for the climb over the Siakiyous, reaching the summit at 11:30 o'clock.

"Climbing the winding grades with caution, we had no difficulty. In many places dirt had been thrown on icy spots recently, but the ice was melted off where the sun could reach it. We did not need chains and saw none on cars that we met.

"Six miles beyond the summit the pavement ends at the state line. Then we had a dirt road for 52 miles. It was in good condition, however, and very little of it bumpy. From Yreka to Dunsmuir it was cold and a little foggy. Not until we got near Weed did we see Mount Shasta.

"Leaving Dunsmuir at 3 o'clock, we started down the canyon that winds a tortuous route for 65 miles to Redding without a town between.

"The road is being rebuilt the most of the way. Many of the hairpin curves are being eliminated and many of the ravines are being bridged.
