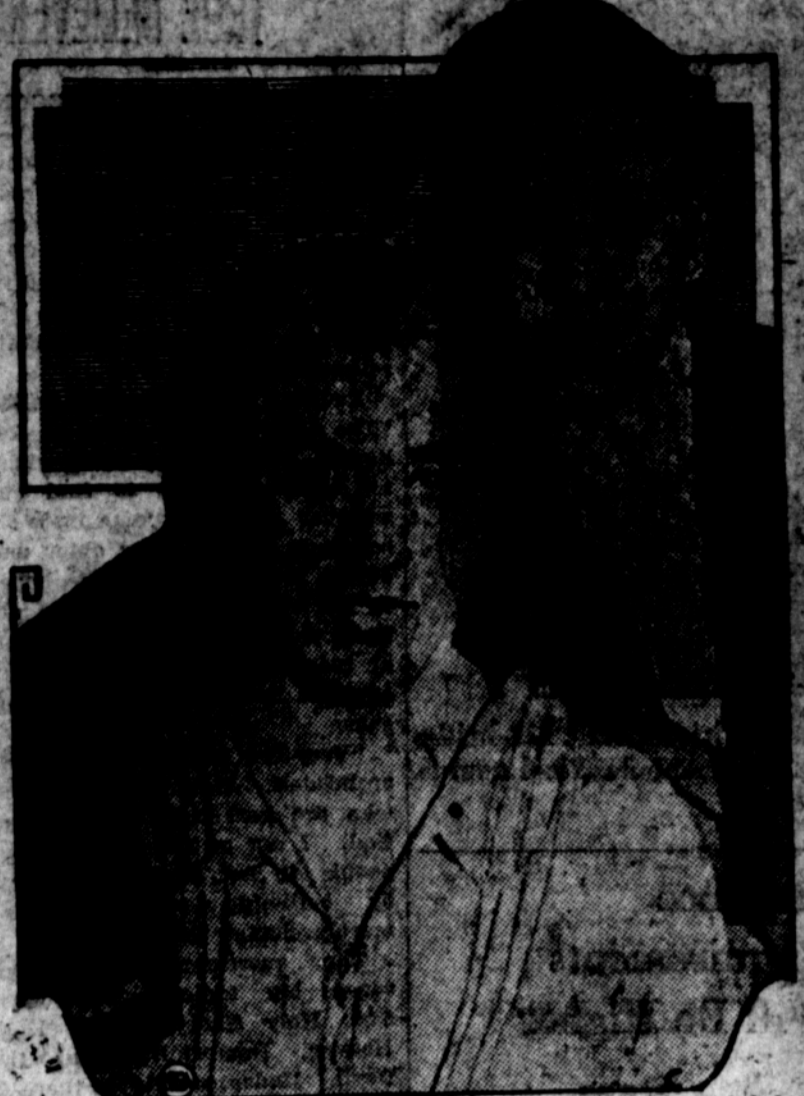


### Loss Hands, Gains Mother
