WANTS 50 YEARS TO CLAIM ESTATE

OLYMPIA, Wash., Feb. 13.—(U.P.)—Fifty years would seem to most persons a long wait before seeking property left in an estate, but C. S. Reinhart, clerk of the state supreme court, has just received that kind of a query.

An attorney in MacKay, North Queensland, Australia, wrote to Reinhart, asking if unclaimed funds or property were held by the court in the estate of Lydwig Schaeeling, who died about 50 years ago.

Investigation here disclosed that Schaeeling's next of kin were sought by advertisements in German newspapers between 1875 and 1885. Reinhart was able to find no record of any Schaeeling property held here.

The president has been told that the senate judiciary committee will report adversely on both nominations, but he is expected to exhibit his usual determination and refuse to withdraw the nominations.
