### LINCOLN DAY BANQUET GETS RECORD CROWD

service, however great, unique and holy. Yet if it be true that Providence designed this noble character for a peculiar mission, I am sure that the task of preparation began far in the dim concourse of his ancestry and that the infant Lincoln held within his dawning soul the true seed of greatness. For he was, when all is said, himself and no other. I hold, too, that even as he came to America in an hour of need, so had America prepared herself and him for the task ahead. These two were in and of a plan conceived, I doubt not, when the universe was young. As Lincoln was destined to direct this nation, so was the nation destined to shape the thought and impulses of a great mind and a generous heart.

#### Masterful Talk

In a masterful way Mr. Piper traced those principles, which were manifest from the first, that gave form and energy to the noble nature of Abraham Lincoln. "I am among those who think that the Abraham Lincoln, through all the years of his mature life, was preparing himself, or being prepared, for the supreme work he was called to do; and when the mighty task was devolved upon him I firmly believe that there was a definite transition, separation and elevation of spirit and soul from their physical tenement to the serene and certain atmosphere of great purpose and great destiny," Mr. Piper stated.

"The life of Lincoln was ended 41 years ago, yet the memory of Lincoln is a living force in the onward march of America today, a growing influence and a blessed inspiration in the upward struggle of oppressed peoples throughout the world," he continued.

#### A Mother's Love

"He had none of the comforts of a real home as we know it, except one—a single great and beautiful gem in the stern life of a frontier household—the tender grace of a mother's love. Nancy Hanks! Mother of Lincoln! Oh, most inestimable privilege, most cherished memory, most rare gift of God. She had active to her the precious qualities of a good woman; and she had acquired somewhere and somehow the graces that adorn a sensitive and intelligent mind," he said after naming many of the modern conveniences which Lincoln had missed in his primitive, frontier life.

speaker traced Lincoln's journey throughout the war period, and concluded with this epigrammatic note: "Thus, we have had a glimpse of the unbelongable career of the greatest American. No other story is like it; no other one given in all American history and but one other in all history, probably, known from its lowly beginnings to such great heights of merited glory; no other's memory flowers so perpetually in the American heart; no other from the silent haven of everlasting peace beholds a great people bowed constantly at his feet in such affection and reverence; no other in his life so completely consecrated himself to high duty; no other performed his duties with such benignity, such understanding, such patience and such unflinching determination to go forward as God gave him to see the right; no other bared his breast with such calmness and resignation to the shafts of ridicule, contempt and falsehood; no other bore great honors with such humility and yet no other was more completely the captain of himself; and no other, when the moving finger had completed his chapter and the book was closed, left so perfect a record of great work well done. The stone which the builders rejected became the head of the corner."

#### Reminiscences of Lincoln

By L. P. Hubbard, a G. A. R. veteran, were read by Judge William A. Colvig. Among other recollections was the fact that he had illegally voted for Mr. Lincoln for president before he became of age—an act which he stated had never hurt his conscience.

#### Telegrams Read

Mr. Vining announced that several familiar faces were absent at this banquet and he said he particularly regretted that "Dick Poyer" could not be present. Also R. C. Washburn, a veteran of the Lincoln banquet. Telegrams were read from Ralph E. Williams, national committee-

man, R. S. Washburn of Portland; Jay Upton, candidate for governor; Robert N. Stanfield, U. S. Senator; the Eugene Lincoln Club; Alfred E. Clark, Portland; Charles Hall, Marshfield; E. V. Carter, Ashland. Many letters that had been received were not read.

Mr. L. Patterson, Republican candidate for governor, was introduced as the man "who intended to wipe the tears from the Bald Faced Calf's eyes, the sting from his horn and who intended to change the color of the said calf." The owner of this Bald Faced Calf was represented as one who loved to picture the farmer as a character who was starving and downtrodden. Mr. Patterson said it was impossible today to tell the farmer from the city man and that farm conditions had changed for the better.

#### Many Introduced

Mrs. Elsie I. Bishop, who is visiting in Ashland for a short time, was introduced as one who "often sat upon the lap of Abraham Lincoln" back in Illinois. Included in those who were introduced were: E. E. Blanchard, state committeeman of Grant Pass; Robert Kuykendall, Klamath Falls; State Representative Cramer of Grants Pass; Captain A. E. Burdett, ex-state game warden; Ed Fawcett, Albany; Judge Burnett, of the Oregon Supreme Court, who stated Lincoln's ideals were the basis of his greatness and that Americans should devote their time, lives and sacred honor to perpetuating these ideals; E. D. Cusick, Albany and campaign manager of Robert N. Stanfield.

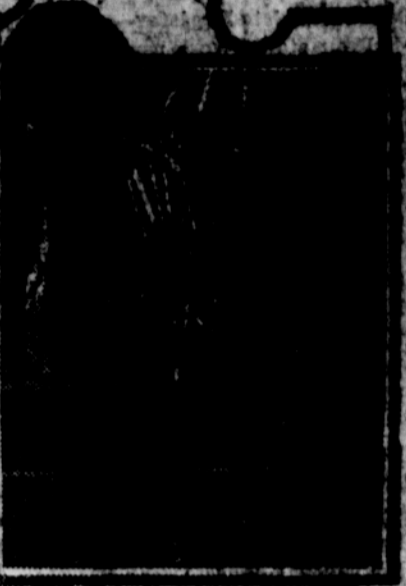

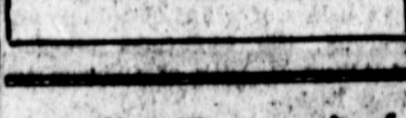
