### OREGON'S BIRTH IS CELEBRATED

PORTLAND, Ore., Feb. 16.—Oregon was 67 years old Sunday.

Sixty-seven is comparatively youthful in the life of a state, and so, as befitted the occasion, a birthday party was held Saturday night at the Portland Chamber of Commerce at which some 500 guests were seated.

It was typically a birthday party. Flowers decorated all the tables; an orchestra played, vocal solos were contributed, a huge birthday cake graced by 67 candles, held a place of honor.

Miss Oregon herself was present in the form of Miss Helen Gray Gatens, daughter of Judge and Mrs. William N. Gatens, a dainty maid, who wore a becoming crinoline type dress with distinction. And so was Uncle Sam on hand in the person of Stephen W. Matthieu, grandson of F. X. Matthieu, who took a prominent part in the formation of the provisional government at Champeog, May 2, 1843.
