and informed them he would detain them until he had checked up on their old license. The car was placed in a garage. The trio asked to be allowed to go to a restaurant to get something to eat and the chief permitted them to do so.

Instead of returning for their car, they fled the city and nothing more was heard from them until yesterday when Chief McNabb got a letter from them dated at Grants Pass Monday, in which they signed themselves "The Bandit Trio," and informed the chief that they were headed for Portland.

Want To Be "Tough"
It was a boastful, foolish letter they wrote. They wanted to impress the chief that they were "tough." They admitted in the letter that they were wanted in San Bernardino.

Chief McNabb wired San Bernardino and got a reply that Robinson was wanted on a for-gery charge, and Comstock for larceny by bailer for taking his car outside the state of California.

But before the local police officials could trace the young trio north, he received a wire of their apprehension at Dunsmuir. They had doubled back on their tracks at Grants Pass, and all three of them, including Robinson's young bride, were beating their way on a freight train when caught.

They probably will be held at Dunsmuir until the San Bernardino officials can send for them. The Chandler car as well as all their personal belongings are being held here by Chief McNabb.

LONDON, Feb. 17—(U.P.)—Marrying foreign women in order to give them British nationality has become almost a vocation with some Englishmen, according to a Scotland Yard investigation. Investigators discovered men who had contracted as many as three marriages with foreign women, receiving from \$50 to \$100 per marriage. The investigation was ordered when it was noted that deportation proceedings against a number of undesirable women were blocked by their establishment of British nationality through marriage.
