Discussing the discoveries, Dr. W. A. Bryan, director of the Los Angeles Museum, said:

"The animals that left these bones were all of a type that eased to exist in this part of the world thousands of years ago. The mastodon was a primitive elephant, larger in size than his descendant, the modern African or Asiatic elephant.

"The ground sloth, a large slow-moving herbiverous animal, is now represented by animals of the same family found only in South America, while descendants of the camel, which is supbosed to have originated in America, are at present found only in the Old World."
