SUPERSTITIONS OF EGYPT ARE GIVEN

CAIRO, Feb. 19.—(U. P.)—Walk around a mummy and you'll have good luck. Step over it, and you'll have better luck still.

This is one of the superstitions brought out of Egypt by a party of excavators returning from an exploration expedition in the heart of the "mummy country."

They found that amongst the native Egyptians almost any object connected with the long-dead civilization of their country is regarded as a fetish and especially as a charm to ensure the birth of a son and heir. This, the Egyptians, like most Oriental peoples, consider to be a matter of utmost importance, no matter what may be the standing of the family.

"We found," said a member of the party, "that mummies are considered to be especially powerful charms in this connection, but not all mummies. Just what reasons govern the choice of a mummy for this purpose is a mystery we were unable to solve. We found for instance

that sometimes the most battered remains were preferred to other mummies that were in good condition.

"Women either walk around the mummy or step over it for a certain number of days in the hope of bearing the coveted 'male child.' One case that was brought to our notice was that of a native servant, who before divorcing his wife because she was barren, tried his own hand at walking around and stepping over a mummy. It didn't work, however, and he divorced her anyway."

Another superstition of Egyptian women is that if they walk around the Great Pyramid seven times, sunrise, they will be insured the birth of a male child. Similar perambulations are made around many other monuments, and sometimes pieces of stone are chipped off statues or temples to be used as charms. In consequence some monuments have had to be protected with iron railings on account of the damage done by charm-hunters.

GETTING GOLD IN LOS GATOS HILLS

LOS GATOS, Cal., Feb. 19.—(U. P.)—Gold is being dug from the foothills here, right in the town of Los Gatos.

That the gold is not in paying quantities as yet is of no particular consequence, since the owner of the property, Bert Schlesinger, a prominent San Francisco attorney, is wealthy enough so that the gold digging can be a hobby.

The discovery of the gold was accidental. With some friends

he was walking over his 60-acre estate. One man, a mining expert, kicked an outcropping of rock in his accustomed experimental way and halted with one foot in mid-air.

"There's gold here!" he exclaimed.

And gold it proved to be. A tunnel has been driven into the hills for 180 feet and ore is being extracted that assays \$7 to the ton.
