The official said two or three good storms would easily fill this reservoir. Hyatt reservoir has 7500 acre feet of water stored now. The real run-off to this reservoir comes later in the spring when the snow starts melting and there will be no difficulty in filling this reservoir, which had 9,500 acre feet last year.

About 20 men are being worked now by the district in cleaning the ditches in the Bellview and other districts. An early dry spring may mean the starting of irrigation early in April.
