Mrs. Draper formerly was the wife of D. A. Harvey of the 51st and 52nd Congress who aided in framing the bill for Oklahoma's entry into statehood.

She now lives in Oklahoma City with her present husband a Civil War veteran.  
When the wife of Congressman Harvey, she was entertained by Presidents Harrison and Cleveland.  
Her grandfather, Thomas Morris, Ohio senator, obtained General Grant his appointment to the U. S. Military Academy.


