## FIXING THE BLAME FOR FIRES

The disposition to regard fires as the business of Providence and the insurance companies is giving way in fortably when you are pushed to some quarters to the idea of holding the culpable responsible. Inquiries received by the Chamber of Commerce of the United States indicate a growing interest on the part of member organizations in the possibilities of enacting legislation making those who through negligence or otherwise start fires personally liable for the damage they cause.

The personal liability theory prevails generally in European countries and has been endorsed by the National Chamber. The European property owner whose house or factory burns down must explain to the satist faction of the civil authorities that he has done his best to prevent such a catastrophe. If he cannot, he might find himself obliged not only to stand the loss he has suffered but to reimburse his neighbors for the damages they have sustained. A fire is not only a misfortune but immediately raises the question of negligence.
