## TRAINING QUARTERS TO BE ESTABLISHED

Tentative plans for the Cas-  
sons Military Training Camps  
in the Pacific Northwest for  
1928 contemplate the location of  
camps at Vancouver Barracks,  
Camp Lewis, Fort Worden and  
Fort George Wright.

As planned the largest camp  
in this area will be held at  
Vancouver Barracks where the  
Infantry candidates from Oregon  
and a large part of Washington  
will be trained. Fort George  
Wright, near Spokane, Wash-  
ington, will also be an infantry  
camp, where candidates from  
Eastern Washington and North-  
ern Idaho will be assigned.

"Service to members is op-  
erated through a chain of gar-  
ages and repair shops through-  
out the country," he says. "This  
conflicts with the thief's plans,  
since it is the custom to store

his car his first thought is to  
report it to the police. Since the de-

position to render a new type of  
assistance by notifying all its  
officially-appointed garages and  
service organizations. Even if  
the thief removes the club em-  
blem these service companies  
have a full description of the  
car and are on the lookout for  
it. Because service is national  
through the A. A. A. and its af-  
filiated clubs throughout the  
country, the check is effective  
whether the thief takes the car  
to another city or tries to hide  
it in the locality where it is  
owned."

## A. A. A. MEMBERS GET PROTECTION

Few of the cars that are stol-  
en belong to members of the  
Oregon State Motor Association,  
according to a statement by  
George O. Brandenburg, general  
manager of the Oregon associa-  
tion today.

The statement is the result  
of an investigation made by  
the American Automobile As-  
sociation, of which the local  
club is a prominent affiliation,  
showing that few club members  
have their cars stolen, despite  
the fact that about one out of  
every fifteen car owners be-  
long to the club.
