#### CLOSING THE ROGUE

Action was taken Monday in Portland by the Ore on Sportsmen's association advocating the closing of Rogue river and other coast streams to commercial fishg says the Grants Pass Courier. The association recogizes the growing importance of the perpetuation of Oreon's premier fishing streams as tourist attractions, and taking this means of beginning a move which will ventually put the Regue among those streams which re reserved for the sport fishermen, allowing commerdal interests to keep those streams which are recognized rimarily as best suited for such purposes.

Results obtained in the past have shown that it is scarcely possible to close Rogue River for the commercial atterests for many years. Sportsmen throughout the tate have begun to feel that they cannot cope with the mancial interests which have large sums invested in the industry and who are willing to use their money to maintain it. The time is ripe, however, for the starting of a campaign of education to show the necessity of setting side some of the more accessible streams, such as the Hogue, for the sport of fishing.

It is hardly to be hoped that the Rogue will be closed within the next few years. But it is highly probable that a favorable sentiment can be created which will, in future years, result in making the river one of those reserved for sport fishing and make it one of the best known in the world among fishermen.

The value of the tourist fishing can scarcely be overastimated and very few years will elapse before all available sites along the river, between Grants Pass and Gold Beach, will have taken by anglers who wish to maintain summer homes.

One reads in sporting magazines of the streams of the east noted for their fishing, but anglers are agreed that the fighting steelhead of the Rogue furnishes the greatest sport of them all. Zane Grey and others are doing their part in giving publicity to the Rogue and in a few years this stream will be as well known as any. The steelhead fishing must therefore be maintained or the OUT OUR WAY advertising being received will have a worse effect than no publicity at all.

Sportsmen of Southern Oregon are glad to note that the Rogue is being given attention by such organizations as the Oregon Sportsmen's association and feel that with such organizations enlisted in the fight, Oregon trout streams may be preserved as the property of the entire country instead of a few individuals.


