TOWN OF KENNETT WILL DISAPPEAR

KENNETT, Cal., Feb. 25—After two decades of turning out mining wealth, this town is passing into the realm of phantom villages.

The death blow of Kennett was struck when the United Commercial company, San Francisco, bought for half a million dollars virtually all of the northern half of the town, and will sell it piecemeal as junk.

Included in the wreckage under way are the smelting works, pining machinery, office buildings and cottages which cost the United States Smelting and Refining company nearly \$5,000,000 to install for the 20-year operation of the rich Eoystone and Mammoth copper mines in the hills back of the town.

The end of Kennett's glory came last August, when it was found that all the better ore had been mined, and that it did not pay to refine the residue.
