dry subject, but Mr. Simpson wove into his talk interesting facts relative to the history of locks. In the early history of lock making, contests were held to determine the prize lock-pickers. The case and certainty with which these experts picked every lock made brought on the development of the present-day intricate combination and time-locks. He brought out the fact that until recently all locks were manufactured in the east, but that today locks of equal quality were being made on the Pacific coast.

G. A. Briscoe, who has been superintendent of the local public schools for some 15 years, was introduced in recognition

UNIVERSITY OF OREGON.
Eugene, Feb. 26—(Special)—Establishment of a school of religion near the campus, supported and manned by the churches, but with the work under the supervision of one of the deans of the University, is being planned as a result of the recent religious conference, according to Rev. Bruce Giffen, University pastor for the Presbyterian church.

With the hope that the University will give limited credit for courses in the proposed school, a definite plan is to be formed for presentation to the faculty by a committee composed of Rev. Giffen, Rev. Father Edwin V. O'Hara, and Dr. H. D. Sheldon, chairman of the administrative committee.
