24 points against the Klamath team, as against the 44 for Ashland Saturday night. If comparisons count for anything, Medford is due for a stormy session when it invades Ashland next Friday evening. In fact, if the local boys show the same flash of brilliant playing as they displayed Saturday night, it looks like a rocky road ahead for the "stalling" champions of Southern Oregon.

Play Clean Ball
One noticeable change in the Klamath style of play is the absence of "roughing" which has characterized their work in former years. Like Coach Hughes of Ashland, French, the Klamath coach, drills clean sportsmanship into the boys at all times. It was a good clean game from start to finish, and although hopelessly outclassed, the Klamath boys fought gamely until the end.

The Ashland "Ponies" proved they have some likely material coming up in a year or two for the regular team when they took the measure of Central Point's second team, 31 to 14. The first half ended 12 to 6, but the local youngsters found themselves in the two final periods and took the lead by a comfortable majority.
