PROGRESSIVE CITIES

The cities of America are making more rapid progress today than ever before. It is not so much that they are growing faster in population, as that they are making community gains, in industrial progress, education, street construction, wholesome recreation, etc.,

Some cities make more than a normal record of de-

velopment, while some make less. Why this difference? The difference may be caused by the fact that some cities have a very active group of hustlers, who almost work their heads off in the effort to secure progress. It is more likely to be due to the fact that in those cities progressive movements of all kinds are welcomed, and that the people generally take hold and join the Chamber of Commerce of like organizations. Thru these associations public sentiment favorable to progressive moves is disseminated throughout the city, and the people respond favorably, when new ideas are advanced.

END LAME DUCK SESSIONS

The House of Representatives committee has recommended for passage,, with slight modifications, the Senate measure for advancing the date of Presidential inaugurations and the sittings of new Congresses. This is the so-called "lame duck" sessions bill. This time there is considerable chance of its passage. If so, the move can be credited, more than anything else, to the clash of wits over cloture in the Senate and the sharp every boob. debate started by Vice President Dawes.

If, declare the defenders of the Senate, there were no "lame duck" Congresses, and no short sessions, closing the most good when applied to at March 4, there would be no need of cloture, such as is urged by the Vice President. So the Senate has rushed this bill through again. It should be voted by the House. If it is, there is little doubt that it will be quickly approved by three-fourths of the states and become a law. It should.

WHO GETS TAX REDUCTION?

The bills that are being put through Congress to lop off millions of federal taxes will benefit the great mass of the taxpayers, including the large taxpayer, the small taxpayer and the non-taxpayer.

Tax reduction is inevitably a great stimulant to industry, to investment and to the inauguration of new enterprises, because it means a lowering of production

Now it is a fact that cost of production is almost inevitably passed on to the consumer, as much as raw material and labor costs, only the item of taxation is a permanent one liable to be increased by state and local authorities.

It is not easily controverted that the sale price of an article, which must be the total cost of production plus a profit, and all cost of operation, is finally taxed upon the consumer. And so it comes about that all are benefited. by tax reduction.


ARE YOU A GOOD CITIZEN?
