

PACIFIC HIGHWAY WILL BE WIDENED, SAYS ENGINEER

SACRAMENTO, March 5.—The widening and straightening of the Pacific Highway through the Sacramento canyon will be continued during 1936. This was announced here today by State Highway Engineer R. M. Morton, who has been authorized by the highway commission to prepare plans and specifications and advertise for bids for the grading of 4.58 miles of the highway from Dog Creek to Lamboine, in Shasta County. Negotiations for rights of way, it is expected, will be concluded in the immediate future. The work will be financed from gasoline tax funds.

Dog Creek is the northern terminus of the reconstruction work now nearing completion. Plans on the next section will be ready for bidders in the near future, Morton said. The work will consist of a bold relocation of the existing road eliminating numerous sharp curves and grades. A wider and straighter highway has been made necessary by the rapid increase of interstate traffic over this route and from Oregon and Washington.

A large concrete arch bridge is now under way at Charley Creek and bids have been asked for another bridge over Doney Creek, both important units of the reconstruction program in the Sacramento canyon.

Since 1922, when the commission determined upon the reconstruction of the Pacific Highway on high standards of alignment and grade, seven contracts,

including two bridges, have been completed or placed under way. Ten miles of concrete pavement have been finished, eighteen miles of primary grading has been done, and thirty-four miles of graded highway reconstructed. The estimated cost of work completed or now under way is \$2,132,000. This represents expenditures by the present commission on this important interstate connection.
