SOUTHERN PACIFIC WILL GET 23 MORE BIG LOCOMOTIVES

Southern Pacific has just placed an order for the construction of 23 three-cylinder Southern Pacific type locomotives, according to announcement today by Wm. Sproule, president of the Company. The locomotives, which will cost in the neighborhood of \$2,000,000 will be built by American Locomotive Company at Schenectady, New York.
Under the contract entered into with the builders, these locomotives will be completed and turned over to Southern Pacific by May 31, 1924, which will make it possible to have them in service before the peak of heavy traffic in the late summer and fall months.
The locomotives are of the type first placed in service by Southern Pacific in 1925, when sixteen were obtained. They are the most powerful and economical non-articulated locomotives yet designed and are used to handle heavy trains over mountain sections in the West.
Their performance, after exhaustive tests in both heavy freight and passenger service, has been highly satisfactory. In many cases they have been used to handle heavy passenger trains on fast schedule in mountain territory where helper engines formerly had to be used. The records of their operation since they have been placed in service show they can be operated with less fuel than the locomotives formerly used in heavy service.
The third cylinder of the locomotive is placed inside the main frames, slightly above and between the two outside cylinders.
The locomotives just ordered will embody some refinements of design that have been de-
