He is accused of defrauding a member of his former congregation of more than \$1500.

THIS JULIUS CAESAR IS GRANTED DIVORCE

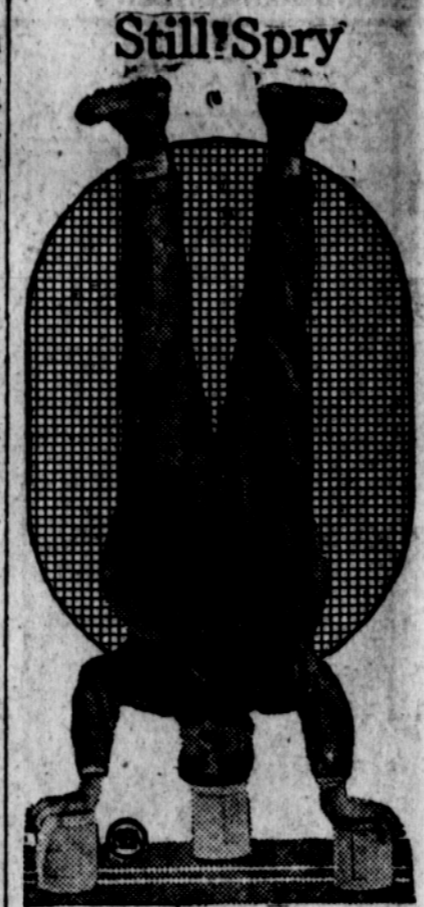
SANTA CRUZ, Cal., March 3.—(U.P.)—What history says about it, one way or another, is of no consequence. Julius Caesar was divorced.
