

EDUCATORS MEETING TODAY IN COUNTRY WIDE SESSION

BY JOSEPH S. WASNEY (UP Staff Correspondent) WASHINGTON, Mar. 4.—(UP)—Specialists in education, 10,000 strong gathered here today for the National Education Association five-day conference to discuss improving school and college curriculums.

To improve educational facilities and to teach the public to support schools in order to give every American girl and boy a fair start in life are the principal objects of the convention.

Taxes versus children is the big issue confronting the delegates. Educators are contending that youth of today and future generations cannot be given a fair start in life until the country is willing to tax the nation's wealth and income for the education of the nation's children.

Colleges and schools are hard pressed to care for the oncoming tide of students and in many sections schools have to operate on part time basis because there is not sufficient seating space to care for children seeking education, delegates pointed out.

A resolution urging rural schools to adopt courses in co-operative marketing will be considered by the conference. Frank O. Lowden, former governor of Illinois, will address the delegates on this subject, urging that such a course is essential to the agricultural interests of the country.

Two days will be used by the delegates for sectional meetings. Sunday a pilgrimage will be made to the tomb of the unknown Soldier in Arlington National Cemetery, followed by Vesper Service in Memorial Continental Hall.

Secretary of Commerce Hoover will address the convention on Safety as a National Policy, stressing the point that educating the children of the country assures the safety of the nation.

President Coolidge will make an address before the Conference Monday evening in the Washington Auditorium. The President selected Washington's Birthday as the time for his address.

Other prominent speakers will include Mary McSkimmon, president of the National Educational Association, Commander Donald McMillan, U. S. Navy, and F. A. Fenning, Commissioner of the District of Columbia.

COAST TENNIS CHAMPS TO MEET SHORTLY

SAN FRANCISCO, Feb. 27.—(U.P.)—Long rivalry between Cranston Holman and Bud Chandler on the tennis courts will probably be settled in the Stanford-California matches this year, when the respective captains take the court against each other.

Holman, Cardinal star, is regarded as one of the greatest of the younger racqueters of the country, and last year was ranked among the first ten men players. He holds the national junior championship.

Chandler, the U. C. leader, is the present intercollegiate champion, winning last year from a field that included Holman, and did not remain in the east long enough to have a crack at the junior title.

KLAMATH FALLS, Ore., Mar. 4.—Scowling God of divorce and the Grim Reaper, known as Death, pressed closely but did not quite overtake Dan Cupid and a long and angular stork in Klamath during the first two months of 1936.

In other words, the age-old conflict of marriage and divorce, death and births, have resulted in close victories for marriages and births.

Records at different offices at the county court house reveal 42 deaths in Klamath since January 1, and 50 births.

On the other hand there were 22 couples who obtained marriage licenses from the county clerk's office during the past two months, and during the same period, 19 couples filed

suits for divorce with the circuit court clerk. 17 of the divorce complaints were filed by discontented wives.

SISLER DECLARED CLEVER MANAGER

During the winter baseball gatherings, several prominent fans and officials engaged in a fanning session and the question of managers was brought up.

"John McGraw and Connie Mack are reaching the end of their careers," one of them said, "and where is the young manager that is going to be as good as they are?"

As the successful type of young manager, Bucky Harris, pilot of the Washington Senators was the first mentioned but it was pointed out that he yet has to show any great ability in developing players.

Eddie Collins was nominated as a prospect and Rogers Hornsby was mentioned for a promising future.

"I think you all have overlooked the best one of all, the smartest young manager in baseball—George Sisler," a veteran American League manager said.

"Sisler," he continued, "is not only one of the greatest of all players, a well educated and intelligent young fellow but he is a natural leader and he has an appealing personality. He knows baseball and baseball players and above all he is a team builder. Just keep your eyes on that fellow. And keep your eyes on his St. Louis Browns next year."

After two deals during the winter, in which it looked like Sisler had out-smarted Bucky Harris and Miller Huggins, the Browns have become one of the most formidable teams in the American League and a real pennant contender.

Sisler showed his first good judgment when he braved the criticism of the St. Louis population by trading Urban Shocker, then one of the best pitchers in the league, to the New York Yankees.
