LETTUCE SHOWS BIG CALIFORNIA YIELD

SAN FRANCISCO, March 4—(U.P.)—Lettuce brought the largest gross return per acre of all California crops averaged over the years 1921 to 1924, according to Professor R. L. Adams of the college of agriculture, University of California. The gross return was \$603 per acre, with celery second at \$602, an acre, lemons third with \$402, and asparagus fourth at \$320.
