## HAX REGULATION.

dreds of taxpagers are contused as to the provisions of the new income tax law and are unable to determine whether or not they should file returns of income this year. For the information and guidance of taxpayers, Coffector Huntley today mound the following statement:
"Income tax returns must be filed on or before March 15 by the following:

"Every existing partnership regardless of amount of income "Every existing corporation regardless of amount of income "Every single (unmarried) is dividual having a net income

\$1500, or more; "Every married individua having a personal or a joint n income of \$2.500, or more; "Every individual having

gross income of \$5,000, or mor regardless of the net income "Extensions for filing return will be granted ONLY under

the following conditions;
"To individuals, whose not income amounts to \$5,000. or more, and to domestic corporation, PROVIDED A TENTATIVE

tion, PROVIDED A TENTATIVE RETURN IS FILED ON OR BEFORE MARCH 15, showing estimated tax, accompanied by the payment of one-fourth of the estimated tax.

"Individuals, whose net income does not exceed \$5,000, may secure an extension by applying to the collector of internal revenue; prior to March 15, and then ONLY in case of sickness or absence from the state of the taxpayer."
