CHINESE DRUG ADDICT FINDS MORE DOPE

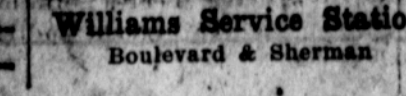
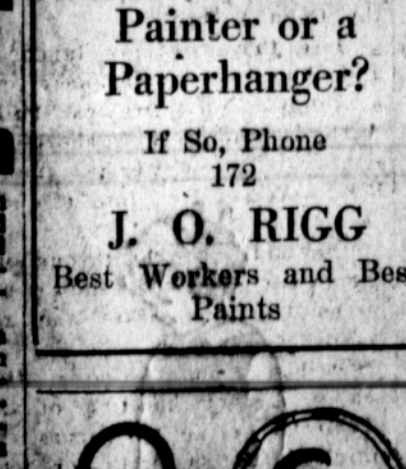
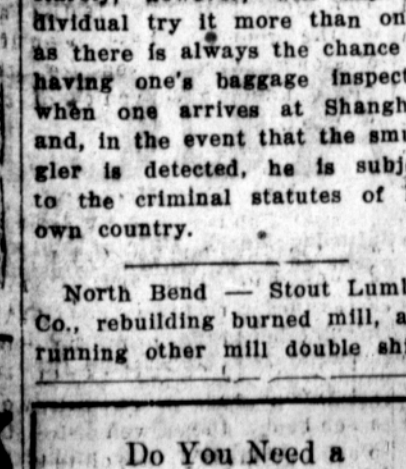
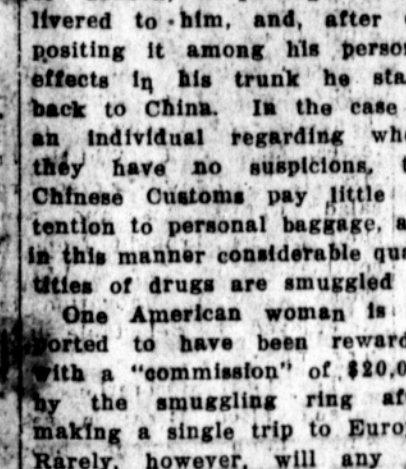
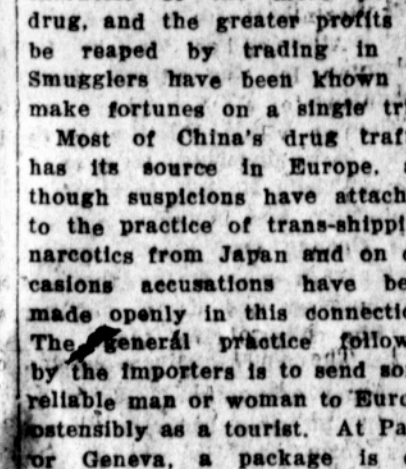
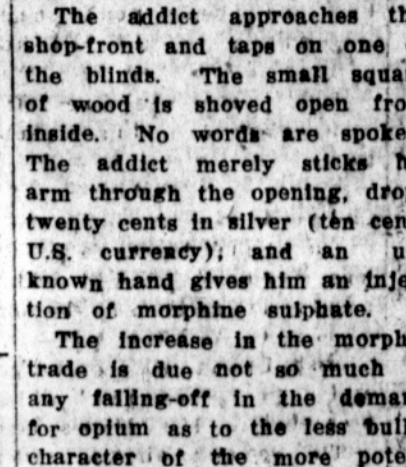
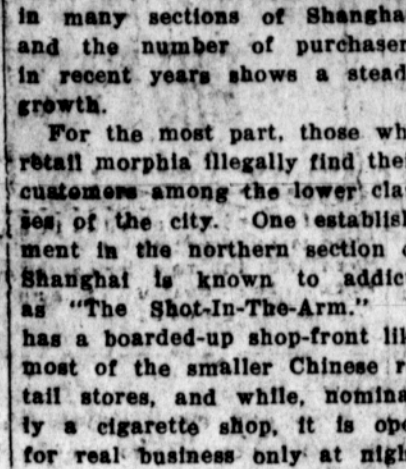
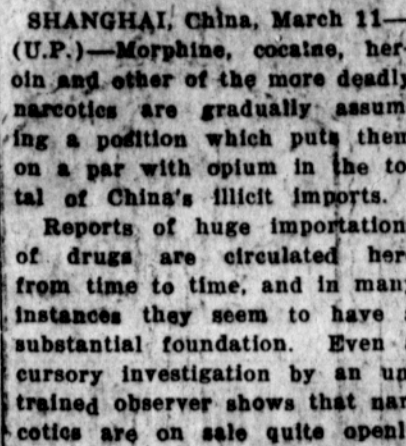

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SHANGHAI, China, March 11—
(U.P.)—Morphine, cocaine, her-
oin and other of the more deadly
narcotics are gradually assum-
ing a position which puts them
on a par with opium in the to-
tal of China's illicit imports.
Reports of huge importations
of drugs are circulated here
from time to time, and in many
instances they seem to have a
substantial foundation. Even a
cursor investigation by an un-
trained observer shows that nar-
cotics are on sale quite openly
in many sections of Shanghai,
and the number of purchasers
in recent years shows a steady
growth.

For the most part, those who
retail morphia illegally find their
customers among the lower clas-
ses of the city. One establish-
ment in the northern section of
Shanghai is known to addicts as
"The Shot-In-The-Arm." It has
a boarded-up shop-front like
most of the smaller Chinese re-
tail stores, and while, nominally,
it is a cigarette shop, it is open
for real business only at night.
The addict approaches the
shop-front and taps on one of
the blinds. The small square
of wood is shoved open from
inside. No words are spoken.
The addict merely sticks his
arm through the opening, drops
twenty cents in silver (ten cents
U.S. currency), and an un-
known hand gives him an injec-
tion of morphia sulphate.

CHINESE DRUG ADDICT FINDS MORE DOPE

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The increase in the morphia
trade is due not so much to
any falling-off in the demand
for opium as to the less bulky,
character of the more potent
drug, and the greater profits to
be reaped by trading in it.
Smugglers have been known to
make fortunes on a single trip.
Most of China's drug traffic
has its source in Europe, al-
though suspicions have been at-
tached to the practice of trans-ship-
ping narcotics from Japan and on oc-
casions accusations have been
made openly in this connection.
The general practice followed
by the importers is to send some
reliable man or woman to Europe
ostensibly as a tourist. At Paris
or Geneva, a package is de-
livered to him, and, after de-
positing it among his personal
effects in his trunk he starts
back to China. In the case of
an individual regarding whom
they have no suspicions, the
Chinese Customs pay little at-
tention to personal baggage, and
in this manner considerable quan-
tities of drugs are smuggled in.
One American woman is re-
ported to have been rewarded
with a "commission" of \$20,000
by the smuggling ring after
making a single trip to Europe.
Rarely, however, will any in-
dividual try it more than once,
as there is always the chance of
having one's baggage inspected
when one arrives at Shanghai,
and in the event that the smug-
gler is detected, he is subject
to the criminal statutes of his
own country.
