FIRE PREVENTION, A PUBLIC OBLIGATION

JOME REST CHARGE

Total number of forest fires showed a considerable ecline last year, leading to the assumption, that at last he campaign of educating the public to reasonable care gainst fire is beginning to bear fruit.

For example, the acreage burned over in national orests in California was nearly about one-eighth of the rea of last year, and cost of fire fighting was only about ne-tenth., This is more remarkable because there was In increase in number of fires from spontaneous comjustion and other natural and unavoidable causes.

The 1925 report sets a good example for this year, and if the need for constant vigilance is kept in the public aind, we may succeed in still further reducing destructon of our forests through heedless handling of fire.

The average American family living in a house wired electricity, and there are now some 13,000,000 such milies, spends but \$25 per year for electricity utilized or lighting purposes and to operate small household laor saying appliances. 
