

LAND SETTLEMENT WORK IS DISPLAYING GOOD PROGRESS

The warp and the woof of a new committee with the exception of Lane, which will retain its old committee. Arthur Foster, Land Settlement Field Representative, has practically covered the whole state and will continue for the next ten or fifteen days, at which time it is hoped to have the entire organization of Oregon complete.

Those counties that have already completed their land settlement committees and have begun activities are Klamath, Jackson, Josephine, Linn, Benton, Polk, Clackamas, Yamhill, and Lane. All have appointed

PORLTAND, Ore., March 12.—Plans for construction of a new baseball park by the Portland Beavers of the Pacific Coast League will be announced before the end of the coming season.

This is the announcement of Thomas L. Turner, who, on behalf of the club, has secured title to a tract of land fronting on Jefferson and Chapman streets.
